Heidi J. Alley started piano lessons at the age of five under the tutelage of her mother, Margaret S. Brown. She added organ playing at age eight working with William Foxley. She studied piano with Dr. Paul Pollei and Robert Smith. She graduated from Brigham Young University in organ performance with Dr. Parley Belnap as her instructor. Other organ teachers include Dr. J.J. Keeler and Dr. Kenneth Udy. Heidi is a well-known performer and accompanist at local venues in Salt Lake City including the Assembly Hall, Wasatch Presbyterian Church, and Libby Gardner Hall. She was a featured recitalist at the combined Region 8 and Region 9 Convention of the American Guild of Organists. She also was the local artist in 2007 for the Eccles Organ Concert Series held at the Cathedral of the Madeline. She has served on the local board of the Salt Lake City Chapter American Guild of Organists and will be the President for the term of 2012-2014. She has served for many years as a faculty member of the Church Music Workshop at Brigham Young University. Currently she is a guest recitalist at the Conference Center and Tabernacle on Temple Square. She is the organist for St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Salt Lake City. Heidi loves the outdoors and being active. She has completed two marathons, four Century bike rides, and several triathlons. She also enjoys water skiing, snow skiing, motorcycling, and hiking. She lives in Bountiful with her husband Lynn and is the mother of four children. She also boasts one son-in-law and three fabulous grandchildren.

Colleen H. Brunson, Lyric Coloratura Soprano, received a BA in Vocal Performance from Santa Clara University. She also studied opera in Graz, Austria with The American Institute of Musical Studies. Ms. Brunson then received her MM in Opera and Musical Theater Performance from Arizona State University. Ms. Brunson is the recipient of many awards, including First Place in the Arizona NATS competition. She was also awarded the The Most Promising Young Singer in Arizona scholarship. She was named a Renowned Graduate from Santa Clara University in the Princeton Review of Performing Arts Colleges and Universities. Some of her performing roles include Lily (The Secret Garden), Soprano Soloist (Messiah), Mary (Gloria), Gretel (Hansel and Gretel), Pamina (Die Zauberflote), First Spirit (Die Zauberflote), and Gilda (Rigoletto). Ms. Brunson has served on the voice faculties of Santa Clara University and Utah Valley University. She lives happily ever after with her husband and four children.

Dave Green has been a singer from an early age. His debut public performance was singing in church with a trio of boys at the age of five. Much of his singing since has been with choirs or in stage musicals. He was a member of Concert Choir at Dixie College, University Singers at the University of Utah, The Mormon Youth Choir and Utah Choral Artists. He has performed in local stage productions including Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (Potiphar), Saturday's Warrior (Tod), Music Man (Oliver Hix), Paint Your Wagon, Irene, Joseph and Tom Brown's School Days. For the past few years, he has been studying with vocal coach and concert pianist, Larry Gee. In his non-musical life, Dave works full time as Corporate Communications Manager at Intermountain Healthcare. He is married to a beautiful soprano, Leah, and the pair has five musical children and one potentially musical grandson.

Dr. Daniel C. Harrison completed a Bachelor of Arts Degree at Brigham Young University in 1968. Then he studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London, England. He returned to complete a Master of Arts Degree at BYU in 1973. Dr. Harrison has won many performance competitions, including the 1966 Utah State Fair Music Competition where he won the Advanced Piano Division and the Grand Prize, and performed twice with the Utah Symphony Orchestra under Maestro Maurice Abravanel. He is a sought-after adjudicator, lecturer, and recitalist throughout the intermountain area, and in California.

Scott Rowley has been playing the piano since he was 8 years old. He began playing the organ at 14, studying for four years at BYU. He was a charter member of the Tabernacle Choir's Bells on Temple Square. He is a former Dean of the Salt Lake Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and is currently Director of Music at the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection. He is married and has a beautiful daughter and resides in Sandy, Utah.

Hailed with "honest" and "transparently clean" singing by the Deseret News, tenor Mitchell Sturges, a Salt Lake City native, lives in Tucson, Arizona, where he is under the tutelage of Dr. Kristin Dauphinais at the University of Arizona. Past performances include collaborations with University of Utah Lyric Opera, international music festival La Musica Lirica in Italy, University of Arizona Opera Theatre, Paradigm Chamber Orchestra, and Salt Lake Symphony in Gianni Schicchi, Il barbiere di Siviglia, The Consul & Amahl and the Night Visitors. Rapidly becoming known as an important recitalist, Mitchell Sturges is known for his commitment to exploring and performing a vast array of song repertoire, with a special passion for American song. Mr. Sturges has been presented in recital at venues such as St. Martin-in-the-Fields in London, England, St. Philip's-inthe-Hills Episcopal Church in Tucson, Los Angeles City College, Assembly Hall on Temple Square in Salt Lake, First Presbyterian Church of Salt Lake, St. Paul's Episcopal Church & the Salt Lake City Library.
