M. Ryan Taylor (Composer, Librettist) graduated from the Vocal Performance program at Brigham Young University with a Bachelor of Music degree where he attended on full scholarship. He has sung roles in operas ranging from Cosi Fan Tutte and The Merry Wives of Windsor to Tartuffe and Amahl and the Night Visitors."

Taylor received a Masters degree in Music Composition and performed in his own operas, *Abinadi* as King Noah (produced by BYU in 2003) and *The Other Wise Man* as Abgarus (self-produced in 2006-7). He is currently the

chair of The Salty Cricket Composer's Collective which features the music of Utah-based composers in concerts held three times a year. He is an Opera America conference scholarship recipient for his work in writing opera and organizing operatic events like the 2007 Opera in a Month Composition Contest through VocalWorks.org.

Taylor has also performed in concerts with the Utah Premiere Brass, Timpanogos Chorale and many other Utah & California performing organizations.

Taylor has released four CDs, the latest is a celebration of the American dream, entitled "American Revolutions" and is available on VocalWorks.org. In 2005 he released three children's albums available at SongTonic.com. Of these, "Thirteen for Halloween" has been a best seller on SongsForTeaching.com and has its own dedicated site with games, music, recipes and more at ThirteenForHalloween.com.

As a producer, Taylor has been active in supporting and creating many concerts along the Wasatch Front and providing opportunities for local singers to perform.

Taylor's home site, MRyanTaylor.com, features scores for opera, art song and chamber music. His choral music can be found at ChoirWorks.com.

Andrea has played Maria in Magdalena, an operetta by Villa-Lobos and Melissa Frake in State Fair. She has been a featured classical soloist for many organizations, including a recent performance with the Idaho Falls Opera Theater Company's "Shades of Love" concert. Recently, Andrea placed second in the National Association of Teachers of Singers (NATS)

competition in classical voice, advanced division and will be competing in the upcoming Metropolitan Opera National Council Competition and the NATS Artist Awards. She can be seen in the upcoming Utah Mid-Winter Song Festival in American Fork in March.



Joshua Jensen, Baritone (A Soldier and A Citizen of Jerusalem) has enjoyed singing Italian opera for the last nine years and has sung at the Italian Festival in Salt Lake City for five of them. Other performances include the Italian Gala in Park City, the Murray Arts Festival, the Retirement Ceremonies for Colonel Christopher Kleinsmith and Master Sergeant Nicole Shinn at Hill Air Force Base, and for the Utah Supreme Court. He also appeared with Miss Utah USA 2009 Laura Chukanov and Miss Utah Teen USA 2009 Tasha Smedley at the Hill Air Force Base Assistance Kickoff Event

and sang with the Murray High School A Cappella Choir. Mr. Jensen currently studies with Lynette Owens.



Danica Ann Yates (General Production Director/AUP, Lighting Designer, Stage Manager, A Woman) is glad she has found a home with UNI-PAC. Recently she directed the world premieres of *The Kiss* by Australian playwright Alex Broun and From Deep Within (Scene) by Joey Calkins. Mr. Calkins currently sings with the Timpanogos Chorale, where he also serves on the board. He also serves on the board for the Salty Cricket

Composers Collective (SC3). He recently made his debut as a stage director with Henry Purcell's Dido and Aeneas. Upcoming engagements include directing and playing the title role in Mozart's The Impressario and the title role in Shakespeare's Hamlet.

Cloe Hewett (Pianist) has had a passion for piano and music since her early childhood and has accompanied many vocal productions as well as given numerous solo performances. Ms. Hewett lives in American Fork with her husband James and young children, Spencer and Elsie.
